What does it mean?

What is the new legislation?

Section 54 of the Modern Slavery Act (2015)
Aims to eradicate slavery in the supply chain

Who does it apply to?

Any organisation with a business, or part of a business, in the UK irrespective of sector, providing goods or services with a total turnover of £36m or more per year.

What do I need to do?

Publish an annual transparency statement which outlines the action and steps you are taking to ensure your supply chain and business is free from slavery.

The statement must be signed by a director or equivalent and stored in a prominent place on the organisations website with a link from the home page.

What if I don't complete the statement?

Failure to complete a statement could be used as evidence of non-compliance if modern slavery is found in your organisation or supply chain.

What does good look like?

- Map out your supply chains
- Assess your risk based on your sector, the number of suppliers and sub-contractors you use and their location
- Work with relevant sector organisations to share good practice and risks identified
- Find out what sub-contractors and suppliers are doing to minimise their risk
- Put in place policies that drive the right behaviour in your organisation and from within your suppliers
- Accurately log all the steps you have taken, both positive and negative
- Be realistic and recognise that tackling modern slavery requires a long term approach
- Demonstrate your commitment to transparency by filing your statement on the central registry at www.tiscreport.org

What is www.tiscreport.org?

Central registry for business transparency statements for all businesses regardless of size.
