- The group had a presentation by <u>EcoVadis</u>, who has created a sustainability assessment methodology as an evaluation of how well a company has integrated the principles of Sustainability/CSR into their business and management system.
- The group expressed interest in a presentation about ISO 20400 Sustainable Procurement for the sector. Some LUPC members are looking into ISO 20400 and a presentation by Action Sustainability would be of great interest. Action: LUPC to arrange an event.
- LUPC presented their latest documents: <u>Sustainable Development Goals Tender and</u> <u>Call off questions</u> and <u>ceremonial gowns supply chains</u>.
- Members shared the challenges they currently face, especially around PPE, return to work products and stock and availability of products. A <u>guide</u> has also been created for the procurement of back to work and PPE products.
- Members provided ideas for activities for the RPAG to focus on and feedback into LUPC's responsible procurement policy and strategy and special projects.
